


SCENE IN THE "ELCO" MOTORBOAT PLANT, BAYONNE, N. J., WHERE THE SUBMARINE BOAT CORPORATION HAS JUST COMPLETED FOR THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT 550 "SUBMARINE CHASERS," OR "SEA WASPS," IN 550 DAYS. The boats are 80 feet long, 12 feet beam, and, drawing little more than four feet, are considered practically immune from submarine attack. Equipped with 500 h. p. engines they have a cruising radius of 700 miles at 22 miles an hour and 1,500 miles at 14 miles, and can remain at sea ten days at a time. They mount 3-inch rapid fire guns. "Chasers" already delivered are reported to have 300 submarines to their credit. Permission from the British Government, obtained by cable, was necessary for the publication of this photograph.


