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APPENDIX.

[NOTE. This APPENDIX gives additions and corrections to the Genealogy. The same system of numbering as is there used is followed here, and the large head numbers and the numbers at the left refer to those used in the book and are identical with them. The numerals, from 1 to 10 enclosed in parentheses, indicate the number of the child or the marriage, in that particular family. When children are given, the family name is repeated only when it is some other than Gerould.]

DR. JACQUES JERAULD is said to have come to this country *via* England. In Medfield, Mass., he bought the "Joseph Adams homestead" in 1721. This was about one eighth of a mile from the Jerauld homestead, which, according to tradition, was built in 1765. Dr. Jerauld and wife were "received to occasional communion" in the Medfield church in 1750. He is said to have been seventy-three years old at the time of his death, which would make 1687 the year of his birth. Two sisters of his are said to have died in Medfield in 1748; and he is known to have taken an especial interest in a widow, Ann Lemoyne, who also may have been a sister. The "house that stands near the meeting-house," mentioned in the "will," was occupied and owned, after his death, by his daughters, Hannah and Susanna, by whom a portion of it was sold in 1765. The "will" was administered in 1760, and its witnesses were William Plympton, Eliazer Wheelock and Keziah Plympton. The will of his widow is in the Suffolk Probate.

The negro, Caesar, mentioned in the will, died in Wrentham, Mass., in 1789. Pompey Edes of Boston being his administrator. It is evident that he fell into the hands of Gamaliel Gerould.

The following document, in his hand writing, has come into the possession of the compiler. As will be seen, it is partly in French. The orthography of the document is followed.

Gerould Genealogical Society.

The fourth quinquennial reunion of the "Gerould Genealogical Society" met in the Christian church in East Smithfield, Pa., September 14, 1889, and was called to order by the president, Otis G. Gerould, Esq., of Covington, Pa.

There were members present from Pennsylvania, New York, Ohio, and Tennessee. A letter of regret was read from Rev. Samuel L. Gerould, of Hollis, N. H., who has been largely instrumental in completing thus far the genealogy of the Gerould family.

The Rev. C. C. Corss, who had attended the three preceding meetings, offered an earnest prayer. Several appropriate songs were sung by the choir.

The president's address was largely devoted to the necessity of learning to rightly express the thought we wish to communicate. The report of the historian, Dr. H. Gerould, of Cleveland, Ohio, contained some new history, and the genealogy by families, obtained in the last five years. Total number of marriages, twenty; number of births, seventy-two; number of deaths, thirty-one. Total number of fifth generation now living, sixty.

The total number of deaths by generations were, of the fourth, one; of the fifth, ten; of the sixth, nine; of the seventh, thirteen; total, 33.

The last one of the fourth generation came to East Smithfield, in 1802, and died in 1886.

The following preamble and resolutions were adopted by a rising vote:

WHEREAS, These have left their earthly homes desolate, going in and out with us no more, reminding us that to the aged death must come, and that no age is exempt therefrom; Therefore

Resolved, That we who remain will tenderly cherish the memory of our departed, emulating their virtues, gaining an inspiration to greater endeavor and higher attainments, and thus shall we render ourselves worthy our ancestry, and better fitted for the everlasting reunion, where none will mourn for "the touch of the vanished hand and the sound of the voice that is still."

The following, formulated by Mrs. Phebe Hendrick, of New York, and moved by C. M. Gerould, of Tennessee, was unanimously adopted.

Resolved, That we, the members of the Gerould family, desire to express our long-felt and hearty appreciation of the services of Dr. Henry Gerould in our behalf.

Resolved, That we recognize that to him we are indebted for the writing and publication of the Gerould Genealogy, and for suggesting and encouraging the enjoyable and profitable custom of family reunions.

Resolved, That we realize that in these services he has given hard labor and valuable time for which we can offer no adequate remuneration, and we heartily unite in this declaration of our esteem and gratitude.

A collection was taken for the purchase of a gold-headed cane to be sent to the Rev. Samuel L. Gerould, of N. H., as a slight testimonial of esteem for the valuable services rendered by him in these genealogical labors.

The society then adjourned to an adjoining building where a most bountiful dinner had been prepared. A few hours of social enjoyment were passed and then adjourned until September, 1894.

GEROULD GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY.

The fifth quinquennial reunion of the Gerould family was held in Phelps grove, East Smithfield, Pa., Aug. 29, 1894.

After the general greeting came the usual big dinner, of which two hundred fifteen Gerould kinsmen partook. At 2 o'clock p. m., the company gathered about the grandstand to enjoy the after-feast of toast and song, and to listen to committee reports.

The exercises were opened by a song of welcome from the Smithfield Gerould choir of sixteen voices, followed by prayer by Rev. Samuel L. Gerould of Hollis, N. H.

The presiding officer, Otis Gerould of Covington, Pa., excused himself from making an introductory speech on the ground that he never made an extemporaneous speech without making preparation beforehand, and moreover, he "had never opened his mouth in public but that he got his foot in it."

The address of welcome was given by Ernest O. Gerould, who stated that, though he was a trifle larger, he did not feel nearly so big as he did at the first reunion, on which occasion he wore his first pair of pants.

The welcome was happily responded to by Prof. J. Welland Hendrick of Cortland, N. Y., after which the choir sang an anthem.

The report of last reunion was read by Secretary S. W. Gerould and approved. The report of the historian, Dr. Henry Gerould of Cleveland, O., was read and corrections called for. Some very amusing examples of blunders in reporting statistics were cited by the doctor as evidence of the difficulty of making such work accurate.

Under the head of "General Business," the date of these reunions was fixed upon the fourth Thursday of August every fifth year.

Song,—*"Those Beautiful Days."* Toast, *"The Family Name,"* was responded to by Rev. Samuel L. Gerould. The original spelling of the name, and that maintained by one branch of the family is Jerauld. Among the many items of interest mentioned by the speaker, he stated that each of the three sons of the original ancestor in this country was represented at the meeting, and the representatives were called upon to rise. The family of Stephen was represented by Miss Frances Gerould of Vine Valley, N. Y., the family of Dutee by Miss F. Nelle Jerauld of Galesburg, Ill. The Smithfield branch was descended from the oldest brother, Gamaliel.

The toast—"The day we celebrate," was responded to by Mrs. Laura (Gerould) Craig of Buffalo, N. Y., in the following lines:

THE DAY WE CELEBRATE.

The day the Geroulds come together,
It matters not an iota whether
Old Sol grant fair or fickle weather:
That morning dawns auspicious!
Its gifts are all propitious!
'Tis so ordained to be
Within our hearts, you see,
It is our Jubilee.

The day by Geroulds celebrated,
Young and old, howe'er instated.
Who are by kith or kin related
Unto this Gerould family "we,"
Whether spelled with J or G,

From greatest favored, to the least,
Without regard for west or east,
Are bidden welcome to a feast.

The feast is spread in the woods of Penn.,
The state fore-fathered by honest men;
In dear old Smithfield we meet again;
The town where most of us here had birth,
The dearest spot upon mother earth!
Beneath thy sod our grandsires rest,
Thy storied hills in memory blest,
Thy virtues by our lives confessed!

The day we come to celebrate
With modest words and hearts elate,
Our father's virtues to relate,
Is surely one of our golden days
When *brotherly*, cousinly virtue pays
On every dollar two hundred cents,

And fathers, mothers, uncles and aunts,
And cousins often-renewed advance,

The toast—"Our Fathers," was responded to by Dr. H. Gerould, who stated among other things that our fathers were fond of chestnuts. That once upon a time his father, for want of other means of conveyance took off his trowsers, tied up the legs and filled them with the nuts. But, on returning home, he was surprised to find visitors at the house, making it necessary for him to retire behind the barn to

empty the chestnuts and redress himself. The doctor stated that in those days there were strikers in the land. He alluded to the bold strike our forefathers made for home and freedom, to the strike upon strike that cleared the forests and built the log cabins. He also depicted with his usual humor some *striking* scenes of home and school life.

The chairman called upon other members to relate incidents and Dr. Edward Gerould of Kansas City, Mo., spoke briefly to the pleasure of all.

The toast—"Children of To-day, the Sixth Generation," was responded to by one of them, Flora E. Gerould. She stated that the sixth generation of the family in Smithfield numbered over 140, who were doing their best for the seventh, which already numbered over 300. She spoke of the perpetuation of the family name, and declared that her generation was greater than the preceding—which she proved by citing the stature of a goodly number.

"The Blessed Babies" was then responded to by Mrs. Julia C. Gerould of Cleveland, O., in the following lines:

"Our Dead" was responded to by Rev. Joel Hendrick. In the last five years there had been twenty-six deaths in the Smithfield branch of the family.

At this point of the meeting, the chairman with his usual humor, introduced one of the married-in members of the family, Mr. Loren Grace of Chemung, N. Y., who, in behalf of the descendants of Susan Gerould Rice, presented a gold-headed cane to Dr. Henry Gerould as showing their appreciation of his interest in preserving the family history. The doctor responded very feelingly.

Rev. Charles Henry Phelps, an old schoolmate of the older ones present, spoke of a few historical instances in which the Gerould and Phelps families had been brought together.

After all joining in the song, "God be with You 'Till We Meet Again," the benediction was pronounced by the Rev. C. C. Corss, who has attended all of these family reunions.

Those who knew that the programme had only been made out the day before, and some only being apprised of what was expected of them upon reaching the picnic ground, were astonished at the wit, rhyme and reminiscence of the meeting.
