WILLIAMSBURG 5th. Jany. 1758

DEAR SIR

Capt. Mc.Kenzie hd ¹ me yr. Fr, which inclosed Sundry Papers relating to yr. Dispute with Mr. Strother. ² Mr. Power, poor Man, is gone from Home to try for the Recovery of his Health, which I fear will never be restored to him. Mr. Wythe is also out of Town, so that I can't with any Exactness say when we shall have an Opportunity of giving an Award; however I'll get it done so soon as I can. I am very glad to hear of yr. Recovery from so dangerous an Illness. If you've any good News twou'd be kind to tell it me; The Govr. & his Family it is Thought will embark on Saturday next. I wish you many happy Years & am Dr. Sir
