FROM JAMES SINCLAIR, ESQ. ¹

CARLISLE 20 June 1758.

SIR,

I am desired by Sir John St. Clair to acquaint you it is his desire that you send six men of the light horse that he already required to the mouth of Conogockuk, to escort Mr. Glen² the late Govr. of S. Carolina from thence to Winchester, where he is going to meet Col. Boyd with instructions from Genl. Forbes relating to Indian affairs.
