Captain Hilbert Wallber, Milwaukee, Wis. Killed in action.






Private Raymond W. Limbert, U. S. M. C. 5th Reg., Tonawanda, N. Y. Killed in action.



Sergeant Louis L. Addonizio, 47th Inf., Mount Vernon, N. Y. Killed in action.




Corporal Everett Doney, 127th Inf., Oconto, Wis. Killed in action.
