





A few charter members of the Peacemakers' Club. A famous Royal Air Force squadron, every pilot and observer having to his credit at least three Boche machines.



Yes, life has certainly been turned upside down in Russia. This fellow was once an officer in the Czar's army. Now he's a moving man.




And this youth was a student in the university. Now he's taken out a license and is hitting up a brisk trade in news vending.
