**Glacier National Park, Mount Jackson**

**G**IGANTIC glaciers of the long ago, descending from the Divide, sculptured these wonderful Montana Rockies of Glacier National Park. From these glaciers mighty cataracts tumble to feed scores upon scores of lovely green lakes in the mountains. From these lakes sparkling mountain

torrents rollick away through majestic forested valleys all abloom with wild flowers. Over all the region the Blackfeet, who were once its owners, have woven a mantle of Indian romance. This region was not visited by white men until 1853. It was made a national park by Act of Congress in 1910.
