


Active Military Operations in German East Africa



BRITISH ACTIVITIES IN THE CAMEROONS, AFRICA, WERE OFTEN HAMPERED BY LACK OF WATER. NATIVE WOMEN CARRIERS ARE HERE SEEN CARRYING WATER TO A TRACTION ENGINE FROM STREAM EIGHT MILES DISTANT.
