

Returning German Troops Hailed as Conquerors

A curious feature of the days following the signing of the armistice was the reception given to German troops as they passed through their own cities on their return from the front. Wreaths, bunting, and festoons were everywhere in evidence and the demonstrators were frantic in their enthusiasm.
